


FOUR WAYS TO READ REVELATION



- 1. PRETERIST: Revelation is about events in the past
 The events described in Revelation all took place around
 the time of the letter's writing and should be read with
 that historical context in mind. In other words, the letter
 was written first and foremost to Christians in the first
 century, under Roman rule and persecution. As such, we
 need to understand how they would have originally read
 it, before applying it to ourselves.
- 2. FUTURIST: Revelation is about events in the future
 The events described in Revelation were predicted to take
 place in the far distant future, at least from the point of
 view of the original readers. So, the focus is on events that
 are still to come, including times like "the tribulation" and
 "the millennium."
- 3. HISTORICIST: Revelation is about all of history
 Revelation describes the key events of history stretching
 from the death and resurrection of Jesus to his return as
 judge. It can be seen as a timetable, by which we can
 interpret "the signs of the times." In other words, world
 events today are described in Revelation.
- 4. IDEALIST: Revelation is about timeless principles
 Revelation isn't talking about a specific time. It is talking
 about a pattern of events or trends that will be repeated
 throughout history, as an encouragement to God's people
 of all times who face persecution. In that sense, it is a
 "timeless" message.

THE VISION OF JESUS IN REVELATION 1



I turned around to see the voice that was speaking to me. And when I turned I saw seven golden lampstands ... (12)



... and among the lampstands was someone like a son of man,[d] dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest. (13)



The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow ... (14)



... and his eyes were like blazing fire. (14)




His feet were like bronze glowing in a furnace ... (15)



... and his voice was like the sound of rushing waters. (15)




In his right hand he held seven stars ... (16)



... and coming out of his mouth was a sharp, double-edged sword. (16)



His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance. When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: ... (16-17)




"Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. I am the Living One; I was dead, and now look, I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades." (17-18)

THE VISION OF HEAVEN IN REVELATION 4

- God the Father's throne at the centre of heaven, around which is a rainbow like an emerald and from it comes flashes of lightning, rumblings and peals of thunder (4:2-3, 5).
- 7 torches of fire, which are the 7 spirits of God (4:5).
- The conquering Jesus, announced as 'the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David' and appearing as a slain Lamb with 7 horns and 7 eyes, which are the 7 spirits of God. Jesus takes the 7-sealed scroll from God the Father on the throne (5:1-7).
- The 24 elders sitting on thrones, dressed in white, wearing golden crowns and holding harps and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. The elders worship God, cast their crowns before his throne and sing a 'new song' praising the worthiness of Jesus to open the scroll (4:4, 10-11; 5:8-10, 14).

- The 4 living creatures, each with 6 wings and full of eyes all around and within, holding harps and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. The living creatures perpetually praise the Creator God and sing a 'new song' praising the worthiness of Jesus to open the scroll (4:7-9; 5:8-10, 14).
- The 1st living creature looks like a lion (4:7).
- The 2nd living creature looks like an ox (4:7).
- 7 The 3rd living creature has the face of a man (4:7).
- 8 The 4th living creature looks like an eagle in flight (4:7).
- 9 1000s of 1000s of angels praising the worthiness of Jesus (5:11-12).
- 10 Every creature in heaven and on earth, under the earth and in the sea, praising Jesus and God the Father (5:13).



TIMELINE OF **END TIME EVENTS**


Events at Seventh Trumpet

- 1. Satan is bound (John 12:31: Revelation 20:2-7)
- 2. God's people raised (Romans 6:5; 1 Thessalonians 4:17; Matthew 24:31; 1 Corinthians 15:52; Revelation 20:6)
- **3. Jesus stands on the Mount of Olives** (Zechariah 14:4)

Events After Seventh Trumpet


Plagues

- **5. 1,000 YEAR REIGN OF JESUS CHRIST BEGINS** (Revelation 20:2-7)

THE 7 TRUMPETS OF REVELATION



The three woes







9:1-12 **5TH TRUMPET** = TORMENTING LOCUSTS

THE 1ST WOE: Locusts with the power of scorpions are released by an angel from the abyss to torment people without God's seal.







9:13-21 **6TH TRUMPET** = MOUNTED WARRIORS

THE 2ND WOE: Four angels, commanding 200 million mounted warriors, are released to kill a third of humanity.





PAUSE = THE ANGEL & THE LITTLE SCROLL 10:1-11

An angel gives John a scroll of prophecy against the nations to eat



11:1-14 THE TWO WITNESSES

God's witnesses are killed by the beast, but raised by God.







7TH TRUMPET = GOD REIGNS IN HEAVEN

THE 3RD WOE: The kingdom of the world becomes the kingdom of the Lord and his Christ. God's servants are rewarded and his enemies destroyed.

THE 7 BOWLS OF GOD'S WRATH





Armageddon.

Three demonic frog spirits gather kings for battle at

7TH BOWL POURED INTO THE AIR

and huge hailstones rain from the sky.

From the throne comes a voice, thunder, lightning and a
